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SUMMARY OF Learn to Play Bridge! LESSONS:

- 1) **Bridge's basic concepts:** Vocabulary, the deck of cards, what is a trump suit, the auction and the play of each hand. The Quest. The rank of suits, basic scoring. The goal as declarer, defenders.
- 2) The beginning of the auction: Opening 1 No Trump, 1 of a major (hearts/spades,) 1 of a minor (clubs/diamonds.) Responding to partner's major or minor opener.
- 3) **Continuing the auction's story:** Opener's rebids and responder's mission.
- 4) **Responder's rebids:** Completing the story. Assembling the picture of the hand.
- 5) **Competitive auctions:** Bidding when your opponents are bidding. Overcalls and advancing an overcall, competitive auctions. Weak 2 openers.
- 6) **Takeout doubles:** Your opponents have opened the bidding, but you have an opening hand. Advancing partner's takeout double.
- 7) Introduction to Artificial Bids: 2 clubs as an artificial STRONG opener, ace asking bids (1430 Roman Key Card.)
- 8) Common ways of Responding to 1NT: Stayman, Jacoby transfers.
